**AEON OF MALAYSIA DONATES RS. RS.8,50,000 FOR THE FLOOD VICTIM
OF PAKISTAN**

AEON SDN Berhad of Malaysia which runs mega chain hypermarkets, “JUSCO”, around Malaysia have donated Rs. 8,50,000/- in the Prime Minister of Pakistan’s flood Relief Fund, 2010.

The donation was made by the Managing Director of AEON, Mr. Naga hisa Oyama to the High Commissioner for Pakistan in Malaysia, Mr. Masood Khalid, in Kuala Lumpur today.

He said that after floods were over, Pakistan was focusing on reconstruction and rehabilitation of damaged infrastructure and damaged and destroyed houses and restore the livelihood of affected people which was an equally enormous and daunting challenge and would require the help of international community including Malaysia.

He urged the Malaysian construction and housing sector to come forward and help government of Pakistan in rebuilding of roads, highways, bridges, schools, hospital, and rebuilding and construction of two (2) million houses which have been destroyed due to devastating floods.

The Malaysian government and Malaysian people have been contributing generously in the Prime Minister’s Relief Fund, 2010. The contribution in the fund has reached to Rs.11.69 million.

In addition, Malaysians government had donated US\$1 million, Malaysian Palm Oil Council donated Rs.39.90 million and Association of Spouses of the Ministers and Deputy Ministers (BUKTI) has sent relief goods of worth Rs. 46 million by two Royal Malaysian Air crafts.

Putra One Club, Malaysia Relief Agency, Mercy Malaysia and Crest Malaysia had also been sending volunteers and relief goods to help flood victims in Pakistan.
